

Denver Workplace Training Program FAQs

1. When is it?
 - a. May 24 - July 26, 2025
2. Where is it?
 - a. Denver and the Greater Denver Area
3. Where will I live?
 - a. Housing will be on your own, and we can help!
 - i. Live where you currently live and commute in for meetings, or we can help you find a place for the summer with peers in the program, or a host family, if you do not live in the greater Denver area.
 - ii. Previous participants commuted from as far away as Parker and Boulder.
 - b. Please see the Expectations on the website for more on this.
4. What counts as “the Greater Denver Area?”
 - a. However far you are comfortable commuting from. Traditionally, those borders are considered: South - Parker, North - Longmont, East - Bennett, West - Evergreen/Lyons
5. How much does it cost?
 - a. \$750 and We encourage you to fundraise!
 - i. Reach out to tim.jordahl@navigator.org for fundraising help, as well as your campus staff.
6. Can we invite friends who are not involved with the Navigators?
 - a. Yes, they are free to apply, but they will have a more extensive interview process.
7. What does the \$750 go to? Does it include food?
 - a. The money will go toward:
 - i. Materials for the program (books, studies, etc.)
 - ii. Materials for large group training
 - iii. Meals for training weekend
 - iv. Per diem for guest speakers
 - v. One meal a week (on average)
 - vi. Some fun events
 - vii. And more
 - b. It does not include food outside that one meal. We consider this a part of the training program for post college life: to live, work, buy food, and cook for yourself throughout the summer.
8. What will our free time look like?
 - a. We would call it “discretionary time” as you will need to prepare your Bible study and other requirements of the program, as well as cook, clean, eat, sleep, sabbath, and more.
 - b. We hope that you will be intentional with your free time, getting involved in the lives of your program community, other program participants, the church you attend, your neighbors, and your coworkers.
 - c. With 2 required times a week to gather and an expected sabbath, free time will be at your discretion as responsible adults.
9. I have a wedding I am in, are you saying I can't go to that wedding?

- a. If the wedding is not during a meeting time, you are free to use your discretionary time as needed. If it is during a meeting time, you will need to discuss this with the Program Director.
10. Will we be required to attend a specific church, or can we go to whatever church we want?
- a. No, but there will be expectations of you in your church involvement over the summer.
 - b. You are invited to attend Park Church with Tim and his family if you want to explore a different church or do not have a local church home in the area.
11. Sundays are business casual, what does that mean?
- a. For men, that means wearing a collared shirt and nice shorts or pants.

12. Can I zoom in to meetings if I don't want to commute?
- a. No
 - b. If sick or required to travel for work, exceptions can be made, but being in person and sacrificing for the sake of community (and training) is part of the training.

- a. This depends on how often you travel. Being in person is necessary for the full training and program experience.
